

Language Arts
Students have been participating in Language Arts lessons that target phonemic awareness, letter recognition and letter sound production. The Lively Letters program makes learning letter sounds fun! As a visual cue, Students are presented with a card that has a picture of a letter dressed up as a character. Students then listen to a story that explains how to pronounce the letter and why the letter is dressed up in a certain way. Finally, they practice making the sound and listen to a unique song that goes along with the story. In addition to the development of letter sound recognition and production, the students of Room 2 are participating in an author study of Mo Willems, the writer of "Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus". It has been fun exploring the different character traits of our favourite blue pigeon as we read a comedic story.

Life Skills

For the month of December, Room 2 has been learning about the different seasons and how to properly dress for each season. Some of the students have been practicing getting dressed for the cold winter weather by using a visual of themselves all bundled up!

This is the third consecutive year that Janus has been a successful recipient of this grant. With our increasing enrolment, we asked for more funding support and they approved! This grant allows all 79 students to access weekly music classes.

UNITY FOR AUTISM
