St. Patrick's Day, feast day of St. Patrick, patron saint of Ireland. Born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, he was kidnapped at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland as a slave. He escaped but returned to Ireland about 432 CE to convert the Irish to Christianity. By the time of his death on March 17, 461, he had established monasteries, churches, and schools. Many legends grew up around him - for example, that he drove the snakes from Ireland and used the shamrock to explain the Trinity. Ireland came to celebrate his day with religious services and feasts. It was emigrants, particularly to North America, who transformed St. Patrick's Day into a largely secular holiday of revelry and celebration of things Irish.



Our classroom focus this year has been on developing strong literacy and numeracy skills. Students continue to flourish under small group instruction, with specific targets to enhance phonics identification, fluency, and comprehension. In math, students are working at building up number sense, measurement techniques, and pattern recognition.

Students have worked to develop skills that are beneficial to their lives. Students have had increasing exposure to skills such as using kitchen tools such as knives. Becoming comfortable with tools such as hammers. And completing daily living tasks such as brushing teeth, washing faces, tying shoes, zipping up jackets, and transitioning within the school.

I would like to extend a thank you to Brittany Rau and Allie Cooper who provided me with some insights to make the presentation a success. Below are some results of my participation in the convention.


Professional Outcomes:
