
Wishing you all a wonderful Spring season and hoping you find opportunities to get outdoors and enjoy time together.

IMPORTANT NOTICE Single Use Plastics!

In response to the City of Calgary's phasing out of single use plastics within our city, please be advised that Janus Academy will no longer be supplying/purchasing single use plastic cutlery to be used at the school.

Moving forward, if a student requires eating utensils (cutlery) with their lunch, we are asking that parents supply these items in their child's lunch kit. 


Around the School

St. Patrick's Day Energy was felt throughout the school, especially in Rm 4.




turning bubbles green. It didn't work, but when popping the bubbles, it coloured their hands green, which was just as great!

Classroom 7

Social Studies:

Rm 7 Students are learning about the medieval period of Japan. They have been learning about the cultural and geographical conditions that were responsible for the isolation of the island nation from 1603 to 1868. Each week we focus on a key aspect of the time period. Currently we are studying the Samurai and their lasting impact on Japanese culture.

Language Arts:

Each week our students are learning eight new spelling words. In addition, they have started moving from writing complete sentences to creating short paragraphs. We are also continuing with our independent reading program where Students take home books based on their assessed reading level and read them at their own pace.



Independent Living:

Rm 7 Students are currently learning about online safety and cyberbullying. This unit explains the dangers that can occur online and knowing the difference between friendly appropriate conversation compared to inappropriate conversation. We are also identifying different types of online bullying.

Science:

Students of Rm 7 have been learning about the properties of light. Learning about sources of light, both natural and artificial, as well as how light can be reflected, refracted, and absorbed. They demonstrated how different lens shapes affect the focus and dispersal of light.
