

Independent Living: (led by Lisa Ames)

Learning objectives include reviewing community safety and the importance of knowing and reading safe condition signs. In addition, students worked on boundaries, online safety, and the importance of knowing the possible dangers when they are on social media or in public places. Moving forward into December students will take part in our social enterprise. This includes working on filling orders, including making gift cards and gift tags by employing the use of fine motor skills and creativity.

## **STEM:** Science-Technology-

Engineering and Math. Students have been engaged in hands-on investigation of STEM concepts using the Lego Education platform. Utilizing the STEAM portion of STEM which includes art, Rm 7 Student groups work together to free build Lego kits to express their own artistic vision or complete pre-made kits based on this year's Lego Education theme. A main component of their weekly projects also includes basic programming. Students have been using the Lego SPIKE essential programming tools to animate their projects with LED lights and motorized movement. They have also been using the Scratch online programming software to create simple executable programs. These lessons are collaborative and have been led and assisted by fellow students in Rm 7.


