

We Rock the Spectrum

This month our class has begun weekly visits to We Rock the Spectrum, an indoor playground specially designed for children on the spectrum. This space provides students with opportunities to climb, swing, and move their bodies in ways that build strength, balance, and coordination. These activities also help with self-regulation and provide important sensory input to support learning back at school. Each week as we walk to the gym, students get the opportunity to practice following community safety rules and we are excited to keep exploring this unique resource throughout October as a fun and beneficial part of our weekly routine!











Community Safety

In group sessions students have been learning about street safety. Students have completed sequencing activities to practice the steps for safely crossing at a crosswalk. We have focused on stopping on the sidewalk, looking and listening for cars, waiting for cars to pass, and looking both ways before crossing the street. Students applied their skills by practicing on a pretend crosswalk, following "walk" and "stop" signals, and waiting for cars to pass before crossing safely. Crossing the street is an essential part of life and we are so excited to see their confidence

continue to grow!


